

POPULATION HEALTH

The Value Based Programs team drives reduction in health care disparities through continuous focus on improving access to preventative health care services. These efforts have resulted in a significant increase in the number of patients accessing services.



ENHANCED CARE MANAGEMENT

Enhanced Care Management (ECM) is a multidisciplinary care team approach to support patients who meet criteria such as chronic conditions, serious mental health and/or substance use, individuals who are unhoused or at risk of being unhoused. In 2024, the ECM team provided services to 2,000 patients in San Bernardino County.



JUSTICE INVOLVED PROGRAM

In 2024, ARMC introduced the Justice Involved (JI) program which has the focus of supporting individuals re-entering the community post-incarceration and reducing recidivism. Community Health Workers facilitate Medi-Cal enrollment, continuity of healthcare services, and general support services to detainees at two juvenile detention centers and five jails.
